## **Mobile Phone Policy**

## **Update on Mobile Phone & Smart Watches at FGPS**

In accordance with the Department's Mobile Phones Policy issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones & smart watches **must not be used** at Fountain Gate Primary School during school hours, including lunch time and recess.

Mobile phones & smart watches owned by students are considered valuable items and are brought to school at your own (student or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone or smart watch to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Where students bring a mobile phone or smart watch to school, we will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At FGPS, students are required to store their phones and smart watches in their locker (Level 3-6 students) or hand them directly to the office when they arrive at school. Students in Level 3-6 will not share their 4 digit locker code with other students.

Students who breach our mobile phone policy will have their phone and/or smart watch confiscated by the principal or acting principal for the day, and stored in a secure location. If a student is found using a mobile phone or smart watch dangerously during school hours, we may be required to contact Victoria Police. Consequences will be consistent with our existing student engagement policy.

Exceptions may be made on the grounds of health and wellbeing reasons. Please contact the Principal if you believe this is relevant to your child.

This policy does not apply to Out of School Hours Care (OSHC), Out of hours school events, travelling to and from school, or student iPads.




# Term 4 focus-

# A peek at what we are learning

## Reading

During reading, students will be extending their knowledge and skills in reading comprehension. This will be done by delving deeper into the reading comprehension strategies to understand why an author uses specific text and language features.

## Writing

During writing, students will be revisiting a variety of text types. Students will be encouraged to use writing as well as images to express their ideas. They will also focus on using language features to express their experiences, events, information, ideas and characters.

## Maths

During maths, students will be learning to tell time to the minute, using both analogue and digital clocks. Students will also learn to create and interpret a variety of data sets.

## Inquiry

During inquiry, students will be investigating Geography. They will develop a mental map of the world and extend their understanding of place through examining the major characteristics of Australia, and Australia's neighbours.

# Level 5

## Reading and Viewing

In Reading and Viewing this term, we are continuing to learn how texts vary in structure and purpose and how an author engages the interest of the reader. Students will explore a variety of narrative, informative and persuasive texts and investigate the structures and features of each text type.

## Writing

In Writing this term, students are focusing on informative and persuasive texts. Students develop an understanding of the structure and features when writing these texts types. They use appropriate editing skills to ensure meaning, and write with the purpose to inform and persuade the reader.

## Mathematics

In Mathematics this term. students will be extending their knowledge of the place value system and revisiting fractions and decimals. They will be applying their skills taught throughout this unit to better understand and representing chance probabilities of outcomes using fractions. Our money and financials unit will follow, and will be immersed with our Business and Economics unit of inquiry.

## Economics and Business


This term the Year 5's will be learning about Business and Economics. Students recognise the different ways that businesses choose to provide goods and services and explore the many reasons why people work.

Students will be focusing on the changing nature of work, consumer choices, financial decisions and how they are influenced by a range of factors. Students will then explore the effects of these choices and decisions on themselves, their family, others, the economy and the natural economic and business environments
